THE PRESENTATION

The Bishop addresses the Rector elect.

N, I am now to induct you to ministry in this parish.

You are called by God to work as pastor, priest and teacher. It is your task to proclaim by word and deed the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. You are to love and serve the people among whom you work. You are to preach, to declare God's forgiveness to the penitent, to pronounce God's blessing, to baptise, to preside at the celebration of the Lord's Supper and to encourage each one in their vocation and ministry.

Do you, in the presence of this congregation, commit yourself to this new trust and responsibility? *Rector elect*: I do.

The Bishop invites people to stand, addressing them in this way: Will you who witness this new beginning, support and uphold N in *his/her* new ministry? *All:* We will.

The Bishop says: Let us offer our prayer to God for this congregation and for N, its Rector elect:

Everliving God, we praise you for the church in this place. In your great love, continue to bless it. Strengthen and sustain your servant N This is my blood of the new covenant shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.'

The Rector says Let us proclaim the mystery of the Faith. Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Therefore we do as our saviour has commanded: proclaiming his offering of himself made once for all upon the cross, his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming again, we celebrate, with this bread and this cup, his one perfect and sufficient sacrifice for the sins of the whole world.

Renew us by your Holy Spirit, unite us in the body of your Son, and bring us with all your people into the joy of your eternal kingdom; through Jesus Christ our Lord, with whom, and in whom, in the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, we worship you, Father, in songs of never-ending praise: **Blessing and honour and glory and power are yours for ever and ever. Amen**

As our Saviour has taught us we are confident to pray, Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins All glory and honour be yours always and everywhere, mighty Creator, everliving God.
We give you thanks and praise for your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ, who by the power of your spirit was born of Mary and lived as one of us.
By his death on the cross and rising to new life, he offered the one true sacrifice for sin and obtained an eternal deliverance for his people.

Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we proclaim your great and glorious name, For ever praising you and saying (singing):

Holy, holy holy Lord, God of power and might, Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

And now we thank you for these gifts of bread and wine, may we who receive them as Jesus said, share his body and his blood.
On the night he was betrayed Jesus took bread; and gave you thanks. He broke the bread and gave it to his friends, and said, 'Take and eat. This is my body given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.'

After supper, he took the cup, and again giving you thanks he gave it to his disciples, saying, 'Drink from this, all of you. that with patience and understanding he/she may love and care for your people. Grant that together they may follow our Lord Jesus Christ, offering to you all their gifts and talents; through him who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever. *All*: **Amen.**

THE INDUCTION

The Rector elect stands with the Bishop The Bishop: I now invite the people to bring forward symbols of ministry to enrich N in his/her work in our community.

A Bible is presented.

The Bishop:

Take this Bible. Be faithful in reading the Scriptures and expounding them to this congregation and calling all to obedience to the gospel.

Rector elect:

I give thanks to God for this privilege and accept this ministry. *All*: We promise to hear, read and study the word of God.

A Prayer Book is presented.

The Bishop:

Take this Prayer Book. Be among your people as a person of prayer, faithfully ordering the worship of the Church and administering its pastoral offices.

Rector elect:

I give thanks to God for this privilege and accept this ministry.

$\ensuremath{\mathcal{All}}\xspace$ We promise to give ourselves to God in prayer and worship.

A vessel of water is presented.

The Bishop:

Take this water. Be faithful in administering the sacrament of baptism according to the commands of Christ and the order and discipline of this Church.

Rector elect:

I give thanks to God for this privilege and accept this ministry.

 $\ensuremath{\mathcal{All}}\xspace$ We will we lcome those baptised and assist them by example and fellowship.

Bread and wine are presented.

The Bishop:

Take this bread and wine. Be faithful in celebrating the sacrament of the death of Christ in this congregation.

Rector elect:

I give thanks to God for this privilege and accept this ministry. All: We will always give praise and thanks to God for the death and resurrection of Christ our Lord.

Healing oil and a purple Stole are presented.

The Bishop: N, be a channel of God's healing, hope and forgiveness in this place.

Rector elect:

I will seek to be a faithful agent of God's healing and reconciling love. *All*: By God's grace we will show God's healing and reconciling love to others.

The Bishop says: N, let all these be signs of the ministry we share in this place.

The people of the parish respond:

All: Be among us as a faithful and loving pastor so that together we may proclaim the good news of Christ, and with all God's faithful people attain eternal life. In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen

The Bishop says:

N, I present you with your licence as Rector and set you in your place among the people of this parish. *The people greet the Rector with applause.*

The parish representatives return to their seats.

THE PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE The Bishop says Let us pray for the world and for the Church Intercessions and thanksgivings for the church, society and the world are offered.

Lord in your mercy hear our prayer.

The prayers conclude with. Almighty God, you have promised to hear our prayers. Grant that what we have asked in faith we may by grace receive through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen
